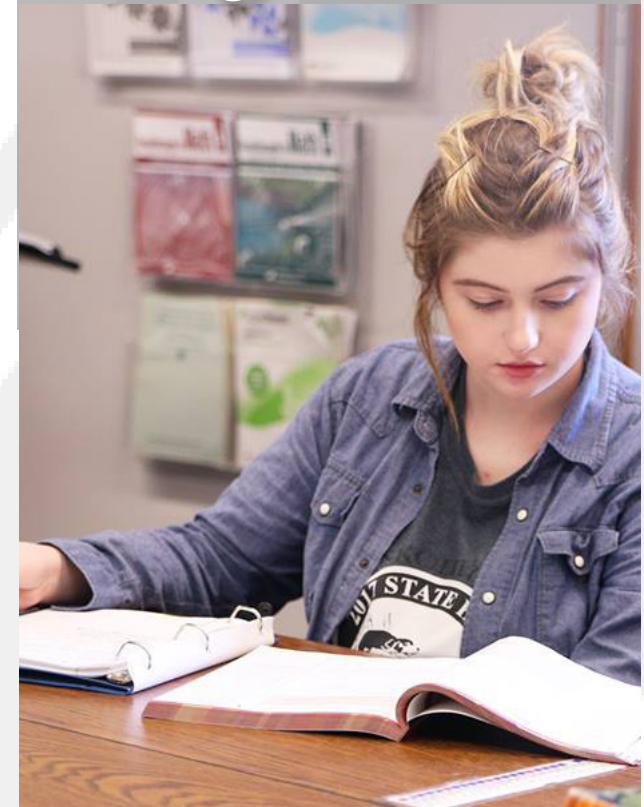

The GED Test

GED tests are administered through any of the four IECC colleges' licensed Pearson Vue testing centers (Frontier, Lincoln Trail, Olney Central, and Wabash Valley)

The four academic components of the GED test are:

- Reasoning through Language Arts
- Mathematical Reasoning
- Science
- Social Studies

Additionally, a paper/pencil U.S. Constitution exam is required to earn the GED credential.

GED practice test vouchers are available to determine test readiness.

Adult Education Classes

GED Test Preparation is designed to prepare students for the GED Computer Based test.

i-Pathways online curriculum is designed to mirror GED testing, allowing students access both in the classroom and at home (with an Internet connection).

Career Bridge courses are classes designed to help students develop the necessary skills to understand and apply academic knowledge to the career industry chosen and/or additional post-secondary education.

Transition Skills Classes are designed to prepare adults who plan to enter college and/or need to build employment skills. These classes are also available online.
